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CONCLUSIONS

The 16-24 group in Sonning Common has a lower mix than elsewhere.
 Likely to be linked to tertiary education away in towns and cities and likewise for first jobs, given the mix and price of housing stock in the parish.

The 25 to 34 group in Sonning Common has a much lower mix than elsewhere. (By 2031 they will be 45-54 and likely to be boosted by inward migration from other areas.
 Likely to be linked to first jobs and early lifestyle in towns and cities - especially given the mix and price of housing stock in the parish.

Note that the upcoming 35-64 cohort have a mix in line with elsewhere. By 2031 they will be 55-84.

The 65-74 group has a mix that is a bit higher than elsewhere. Partly linked to the 60/70s boom in the parish. By 2031 they will be 85-94.

The 75+ group has a much higher mix than elsewhere. This links to the 60s/70s boom in Sonning Common.
