CONCLUSIONS

At March 2011, 66% of residents professed a faith, comparable with wider areas if slightly lower than for England overall. Christian.

The predominant faith was Christian (64.8%), higher than for wider areas.

Amongst other faiths in Sonning Common, the Muslim and Jewish faiths stood out at 0.3% each. The Muslim faith stood at 5% for England overall.

In Sonning Common 25.6% of people professed no religion.

In Sonning Common 8.4% of people preferred not to state their view regarding religion.
